
WHEREAS we never agreed to any limitation on these inherent rights, whether through our treaty of peace and friendship or any other means, and;

WHEREAS the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources believes that it owns the land and its resources and only allows us to continue to harvest these resources through a "leniency" policy.
