WHEREAS the Cree Language Institute will eventually undertake research, support community language initiatives, provide training and develop fully accredited Cree Language courses at all levels;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mushkegowuk Chiefs in Assembly endorse and support the initial establishment of a regional Cree Language Committee mandated to work toward the development of a Cree Language Institute serving the people of the Mushkegowuk Cree Nation.
