
WHEREAS the Kashechewan First Nation has tried to undertake a saw mill operation for the past ten years;

SUBJECT: KACHINERMAN SAW MIT

WHEREAS the Muskiegomuk First Nation is in
the process of settling Government;

WHEREAS the Muskiegomuk First Nation has
agreed to negotiate a saw mill operation for
for the first few years;

WHEREAS the Department of Indian Affairs
paid the Muskiegomuk First Nation for a
six month period for a saw mill operation;
and

WHEREAS the Muskiegomuk First Nation will
not be paid for a saw mill operation for
the first six months of the operation;
therefore it is resolved that the
Department of Indian Affairs pay the
Muskiegomuk First Nation for the
first six months of the operation;

WHEREAS it was based on the fact that the
landings available to the First Nation over
time because of the saw mill
impacts.

THE THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the
Muskiegomuk First Nation accept a supply and
log load from the Muskiegomuk Council for
further development of the sawmill project.
