
WHEREAS the courts of Canada have recognized the priority of these hunting rights over the Migratory Birds Convention Act;

WHEREAS the government of Canada through Canadian Wildlife Service is planning to negotiate changes to the Migratory Birds Convention Act to legalize a spring hunt for northern user groups both aboriginal and non-aboriginal;

EIGHT ANNUAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION

SUBJECT: CHANGES TO THE MIGRATION ACT
CONVENTION ACT

WHEREAS the Muskiegoon First Nation
believes that changes to the Migration Act
would improve the lives of Canadian First Nations
and the First Nations Government; and

WHEREAS the Government of Canada proposed
changes to the Migration Act to improve
the lives of Canadian First Nations by
allowing First Nations to self-govern their
immigration needs through their
own non-profit organizations;

WHEREAS the delegation of responsibility for
non-profit immigration services may safely now
be entrusted with the First Nations Government to
support and assist in carrying out its responsibilities;

WHEREAS BE IT RESOLVED THAT the position
of the Muskiegoon First Nation regarding
changes to the Migration Act by the Government
Act be that the First Nations Government should be
allowed to self-govern its own
immigration needs through its own
non-profit organizations and that the Muskiegoon
First Nation supports this resolution.
