Ontario government representatives recently met with Omushkego representatives and seemed open to a serious discussion of the sharing of revenue received by the Ontario government in the form of royalties and taxes from resource development in Mushkegowuk Territory;

WHEREAS that the proposed discussions are very limited, including at present only discussions of revenue from mining and forestry, and not the many other revenues extracted from Omushkego lands by the federal and provincial governments; and

WHEREAS the proposed discussions, while limited, offer an opportunity for the Mushkegowuk First Nations, acting together, to seriously consider, and possibly productively discuss, a partial recovery by the Omushkego of resource revenues from our lands;

the Chiefs and delegates of the Mushkegowuk Mamowihitowin authorize and direct the Office of the Grand Chief and Mushkegowuk staff to commence discussions with provincial representatives to review and seriously explore opportunities for revenue sharing, remaining fully mindful of the need to continue obtaining the inputs and authorizations of Mushkegowuk Chiefs and Councils and communities.
